

### Citing a Book (more than one author)

List the authors of a book in the same order as they are printed in the book. Reverse the name of the first author, insert a comma, and then, write the remaining names in normal form. If there are more than three authors you may choose to list them all, or to list only the first, followed by et al. (“et al” means ‘and others’ in Latin).

- Last name, first name, remaining names, followed by a period and a space

**OR**

- Last name, first name **et al.**, followed by a period and a space

Then use the normal format for citing a book:

- Title of book in italics, followed by a period and a space
- City of publication, followed by a colon and a space
- Name of publisher, followed by a comma and a space
- Year of publication, followed by a period.
- Type the word Print followed by a period.

Example:

Borden, Sara, Sarah Miller, Alex Stikeleather, Maria Valladares, and Miriam Yelton.  
*Middle School: How to Deal*. San Francisco: Chronicle Books, 2005. Print.

**OR**

Borden, Sara, et al. *Middle School: How to Deal*. San Francisco: Chronicle Books,  
2005. Print.
